Matthew 12:1-14 -- Teachings Regarding the Sabbath

- What do we learn about the Sabbath from Exodus 12:9-11? What is its purpose?
- What do we learn from Matt 12:2-8 about how Jesus regards the Sabbath? How does this answer the Pharisees accusation?
- Jesus quotes Hosea 6:6. How are we to understand God's statement "I desire mercy, and not sacrifice"?
- How does Jesus actions in 9-14 help us to understand how the Sabbath is to be regarded? How does this influence our understanding of the law and the 10 commandments?

Matthew 12:15-21 -- Prophecy concerning Jesus

- It is interesting to notice how the trinity is called out in this prophecy. What does this passage tell us about the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and their roles?
- How has Matthew shown us Jesus fulfilling this prophecy?

Matthew 12:22-32 -- Blasphemy against the Holy Spirit

- What is Jesus illustrating when he describes binding a strong man before robbing him?
- Why do you think Jesus says that speaking against him will be forgiven but speaking against the Holy Spirit will not be forgiven? What does it mean to blaspheme the Holy Spirit?
